COMMUNITY INITIATIVE

- Local Cultural Council Program (LCC) 40-years-old, largest cultural funding network in the country, all 351 cities and towns have an LCC, 2,500+ volunteers, more than 6,000 grants, \$3.4M awarded, written into statute.
- <u>Cultural Districts Initiative</u> Launched in 2011 by an act of the state legislature, 49 designated districts to date, 5-year designation which municipality holds
- The Festivals Program Provide funding to help festival programmers meet the needs of producing, promoting, and developing audiences, established 3 years ago, 4 grant cycles all awardees receive \$500 grants, over \$225,000+ in funding


HOW WE CAN COLLABORATE

5TH COVID-19 IMPACT SURVEY RESULTS

- 1. March 8, 2020 One Year Later: Cultural Sector in Economic Crisis Due to Ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic
- Cultural Organizations Report \$588.3M in Lost Revenue
- Artists Cite \$30.4M in Lost Income
- 30K Cultural Jobs Impacted Statewide





COMMULATIVE DATA FROM PREVIOUS FOUR SURVEYS

- 1. March 24, 2020 <u>Early Economic Impacts of COVID-19 on MA Cultural Sector</u> **Nonprofits report \$56M** in lost revenue, **individual artists report \$3M** in lost income.
- 2. April 15, 2020 MA Cultural Organizations Report More than a Quarter Billion in Revenue Loss and 1000s of Jobs Impacted by COVID-19 Nearly **700 organizations** report \$264M in lost revenue, 91% of all respondents report cancelling events, 95% of organizations with facilities report closing their facility to the public.
- 3. November 9, 2020 <u>Survey Shows Continued Staggering Impacts of COVID-19 on State's Cultural Sector</u> **Organizations report \$484M** in lost revenue, **artists report \$20M**, more that 30K cultural jobs impacted.
- 4. July 6, 2020 <u>Survey Reveals Significant Impact of COVID-19 on Cultural Sector</u> **Nonprofits report \$425M** in lost revenue with 17K jobs impacted and **\$441.8M in total recovery costs.**



RESPONDING TO SURVEYS WITH RELIEF

- March 2, 2021 Mass Cultural Council, <u>MASSCreative</u>, and State Senator Ed Kennedy (D- Lowell), chair of the <u>Joint Committee on Tourism</u>, <u>Arts and Cultural Development</u> partnered on new legislation to create a COVID relief and stabilization fund for the cultural sector.
- HD 2105, An Act to rebuild the Commonwealth's cultural future
 establishes the Massachusetts Cultural Economy COVID-19 Recovery
 Fund, to be administered by the Agency to cultural organizations, both
 non-profit and for profit

RESPONDING TO SURVEYS WITH RELIEF: \$10M GRANT PROGRAM FOR CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS AFFECTED BY COVID-19

- November 20, 2020 Mass Cultural Council, in partnership with the Baker-Polito Administration's Executive Office of Housing & Economic Development (EOHED) launched a \$10M grant program for cultural organizations affected by COVID-19.

RESPONDING TO SURVEYS WITH RELIEF

June 3, 2020 - \$30K in COVID-19 Relief Awarded to Berkshire Theater Professionals - Mass Cultural Council distributes a \$30,000 donation received from the GKV Foundation intended to provide financial relief to theater professionals living in Berkshire County who have lost income as a direct result of COVID-19 related cancellations and closures. The Agency is grateful to Shakespeare & Company for connecting us to the GKV Foundation, as their introduction enabled this initiative to occur. The Foundation's generosity supported thirty (30) grants of \$1,000 each to eligible theater professionals in the Berkshires.

May 21, 2020 - \$3.34M Awarded in First Round of Gaming Mitigation Grants - Mass Cultural Council announces recipients of the first round of Gaming Mitigation grants. In total, 52 non-profit and municipally-owned performing arts centers across Massachusetts will receive \$3.34M to help mitigate the challenges they face when directly competing with resort casinos to book touring artists.



RESPONDING TO SURVEYS WITH RELIEF

April 29, 2020 - Federal CARES Act Funds to Support Creative Youth Development Programs Across MA –

Governing Council votes to distribute federal <u>CARES Act</u> funds received by Mass Cultural Council to 74 Creative <u>Youth Development</u> (CYD) organizations statewide. The National Endowment of the Arts (<u>NEA</u>) received \$75 million from the CARES Act, Mass Cultural Council received **\$475,300** from the NEA's CARES Act allocation, and Mass Cultural Council made **\$7,000** awards to **74 CYD programs** (<u>YouthReach</u> and <u>SerHacer</u> grantees).

April 28, 2020 - Mass Cultural Council Awards \$272,000 from COVID-19 Relief Fund for Individuals –

Mass Cultural Council awards \$1,000 grants from COVID-19 Relief Fund for Individuals to 272 individual artists and individual teaching artists, humanists, and scientists whose creative practices and incomes have been impacted by COVID-19 related cancellations and closures. A total of \$272,000 was awarded to creative professionals statewide. With the support and generosity of the New England Foundation for the Arts (NEFA), who donated \$47,000 to the COVID-19 Relief Fund for Individuals, we were able to make a total of 272 grants.



RESPONDING TO SURVEYS WITH RELIEF: \$10M GRANT PROGRAM FOR CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS AFFECTED BY COVID-19

- Preference given to cultural organization whose mission is primarily focused on:
- 1. Presenting, promoting, and/or preserving the cultural traditions, art, history, and creative expression of people of color, women, people with disabilities, veterans, immigrants, people who are LGBTQIA+, and members of other historically underrepresented and underfunded groups, or
- 2. Advancing and/or supporting artists who are people of color, women, people with disabilities, veterans, LGBTQIA+, and members of other underrepresented and underfunded groups.
- 3. That are in a <u>Gateway City</u> or in an under-resourced rural town.



DIVERSITY AND EQUITY WORK

Racial Equity Listening Sessions

Multicultural BRIDGE, a Berkshire-based grassroots organization dedicated to catalyzing change and integration through promoting mutual respect and understanding, led Mass Cultural Council through listening sessions on how we can support the sector in this time of change.

DIVERSITY AND EQUITY WORK

BIPOC Cultural Youth Development Council

- Mass Cultural Council works with 73 Creative Youth Development programs that partner with more than 9,000 youth across the Commonwealth
- Nine alumni from these programs (ages 18-24) have been chosen to be involved in a six-month pilot and serve in a paid position as a Creative Youth Development (CYD) BIPOC Alumni Council Member
- BIPOC is an abbreviation for Black, Indigenous, and People of Color
- Approximately 80% of the young people in CYD programs in Massachusetts identify as BIPOC.
